Dear Friends in Christ,

We are Easter People! We celebrate the Resurrection of Jesus on April 20th this year. We live in the light of Jesus' resurrection from the dead. No more must we worry that our death is the end of our faith story. Death for the Christian is a new beginning.

We know that Christ, once raised from the dead, dies no more; death no longer has power over him. As to his death, he died to sin, once and for all; as to his life, he lives for God. Consequently, you too must think of yourselves as dead to sin and living for God in Christ Jesus.

- Romans 6: 9 - 11

But what does it mean to be Easter People? The early disciples had a hard time understanding and believing at first, but through sharing their experiences and their stories they were able to believe in the most wonderful truth of the resurrection of Jesus from the dead.

The resurrection is not a past event. Only Calvary and the crucifixion is history, an event in the past. Easter is now, always in the present. Jesus Christ *is* risen. Since Jesus is alive, he is present to all human hearts- often sinful, sometimes sad, yet never rejected, never alone- all because of the risen Lord's presence. That is why St. Paul urges the Romans, and us, to live like risen people *now*.

The Good News of the Empty tomb is a message that is made to send us out in mission to share that Good News with everyone. The new life of the resurrection is not reserved for the few, but instead is made to be shared with the many! It is God's free gift of eternal life for all of God's people. Do you remember when you first heard the News of the Empty tomb? Can you help to spread that news? Christ is risen! He is risen indeed!


Holy Trinity is family, it is a community that celebrates, mourns, laughs and cries together.

Fire Code Update




